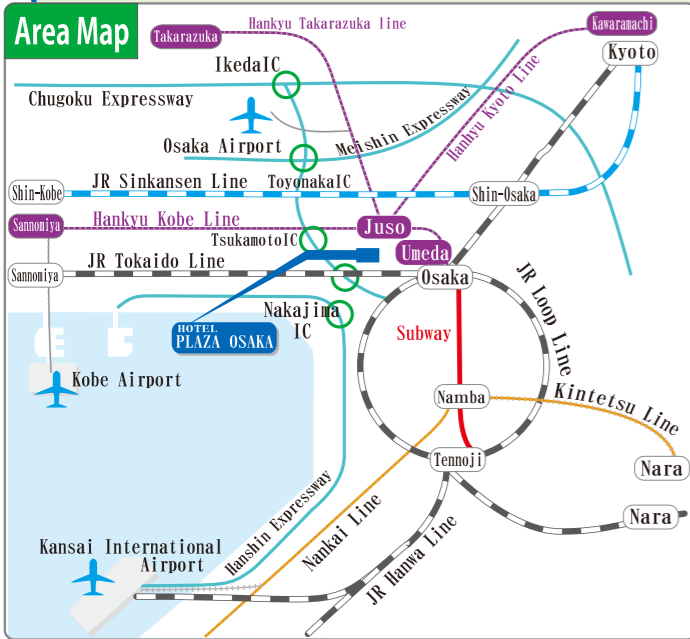

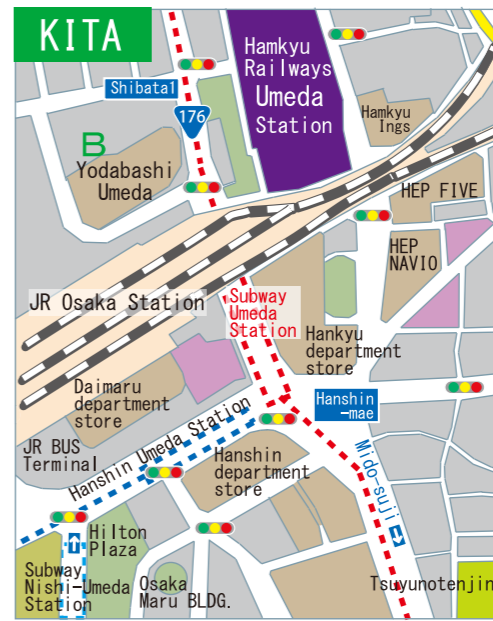

A	Umeda Sky Building	The observation platform of this observatory is a bridge connecting the two towers of the Umeda Sky Building, whose roof features a doughnut shape that provides an unobstructed 360-degree view. The Floating Garden is open 10:00 to 22:30. Admission: 700 yen. Nearest Station: Hankyu Nakatsu
B	Yodobashi Umeda	This gigantic branch of the Tokyo based electronics retailer stocks almost every current item by the major camera manufacturers. Besides cameras you can find almost anything electronic, while the top floor offers restaurants with nice views of the city. Open daily 9:30 to 21:00. Nearest Station: Hankyu Umeda
C	Mint Museum	The Mint Bureau, operated by Japan's Ministry of Finance, has branches in Tokyo and Hiroshima, but its head office is right in the historic commercial hub of Osaka on the banks of the Okawa River. 9:00 to 16:45 (The entering a building until 16:00) Holiday Sat,Sun,Hol. Admission: Free Nearest Station: Keihan or subway Tanimachi Line Temmabashi
D	Osaka Castle (Osakajo)	The construction of Osaka Castle (Osakajo) started in 1583 on the former site of the Ishiyama Honganji Temple, which had been destroyed by Oda Nobunaga thirteen years earlier. Toyotomi Hideyoshi intended the castle to become the center of a new, unified Japan under Toyotomi rule. Castle Tower 9:00 to 17:00 Admission: 600 yen Nearest Station: JR Loop Line Osakajokoen or Keihan or subway Temmabashi
E	Universal Studios Japan™	Universal Studios Japan (USJ) features rides and shows based on some of the film studio's most popular films, including Spiderman, Jaws, Shrek and Peter Pan. The park has many themed restaurants and cafes, as well as shops offering unique souvenirs. Hours: Varies by season Admission: 5800 yen Nearest Station: JR Loop-Umesaki Line Universal City
F	Osaka Aquarium (Kaiyukan)	Osaka Aquarium, also known as Kaiyukan, is one of Japan's most spectacular aquaria. It introduces various forms of life inhabiting the Pacific Rim in a well organized and impressive way. 10:00 to 20:00 (entrance until 19:00) Closed: Some irregular closing days Admission: 2000 yen Nearest Station: Subway Chuo Line Osakako
G	Suntory Museum	The Suntory Museum at Tempozan Harbor Village aims to showcase arts and designs in easy-to-understand and enjoyable exhibitions. It also features an Imax movie theater. 10:30 to 19:30 Admission: 700 yen Nearest Station: Subway Chuo Line Osakako
H	Osaka Maritime Museum	The museum also includes high-tech theaters and a sophisticated Yacht Simulator, the first of its kind in the world. With it, visitors can try their hand at virtual sailing. 10:00-17:00 (according to the season) Holiday Mon. Admission: 700 yen Nearest Station: Subway Chuo Line or New Tram Cosmo Square
I	Asia Pacific Trade Center (ATC)	The Asia Pacific Trade Center is attached to a large mall with popular shopping and dining facilities. The site was designed to host business gatherings and host events, and has large conference facilities for this purpose. Mall Hours: 10:00 to 19:00 Admission: Free Nearest Station: New Tram World Trade Center
J	World Trade Center	Sakushima Island's tallest building offers a spectacular observation deck on its 55th floor at 256meters above ground. Restaurants and shops are found on the lower and top floors, while offices and conference rooms occupy the many floors in between. Observatory: 13:00 to 22:00 Admission: 800 yen Nearest Station: New Tram World Trade Center
K	American Village (Amerikamura)	Locally known as "Amemura," this shopping district is considered Osaka's counterpart to Harajuku and is a good place to see the cutting edge of teenage fashion and culture in Japan. It is a lively atmosphere that is populated with cafes, clothing stores, and thrift shops with a younger feel than the nearby Shinsaibashi. Nearest Station: Subway Midosuji Line Sinsaibashi
L	Dotombori	One of Osaka's most popular tourist destinations, this street runs parallel to the Dotonbori canal. It is a popular shopping and entertainment district and is also known as a food destination. At night it is lit by hundreds of neon lights and mechanized signs, including the famous Glico Man sign. Nearest Station: Subway Midosuji Line Namba
M	National Bunraku Theater	The National Bunraku Theater in Osaka is one of the few places to view the fascinating art form today. English programs and earphones are available. Performances are usually held in three week runs in January, April, June, July/August and November. Nearest Station: Subway Midosuji Line Namba
N	Den Den Town	Located in the Nipponbashi area, Den Den Town is an electronics district comparable to Tokyo's Akihabara, and you may be able to bargain to a better deal. Den Den Town is becoming known as an otaku paradise with numerous manga and anime retailers as well as maid and cosplay cafes located there. Nearest Station: Subway Midosuji Line Namba or Subway Sakaisuji Line Ebishucho
O	Tsutenkaku Tower	Shinsekai is Osaka's "new world," a district that was developed before the war and then neglected in the decades afterwards. At the district's center stands Tsutenkaku Tower, the nostalgic evoking symbol of Shinsekai. Tsutenkaku Tower 9:00 to 21:00 (entry until 20:30) Admission: 600 yen Nearest Station: JR Loop Line Shin-Imamiya or Subway Sakaisuji Line Ebishucho
P	Sumiyoshi Taisha	Osaka's Sumiyoshi Taisha is one of Japan's oldest shrines. Founded in the 3rd century, before the influx of Buddhist architecture from the Asian mainland started, Sumiyoshi Taisha is one of the few shrines displaying a purely Japanese shrine architecture prototype (sumiyoshi-zukuri). Nearest Station: Nankai Line Sumiyoshi Taisha
